sidential Burning in Indiana

ana's air pollution control rules generally prohibits open burning. There are certain agriculture and htenance exceptions to the open burning rule. Smoke from burning household trash, including plastic ainers, is more toxic than the smoke from burning clean wood. Protecting your health is worth the small or proper waste disposal. IDEM always encourages alternatives to open burning such as recycling.

ese rules **must** always be followed:

hly clean wood products may be burned.Treated wood is not clean wood.

ood products coated with stain, paint, preservatives, glue or other coatings are not allowed to be burned. esidential open burning of clean wood products shall be in a noncombustible and ventilated container. ecreational or ceremonial fires, such as fires for scouting activities or cooking may only burn clean wood oducts, paper, or charcoal,

urning must be done during safe weather conditions, not during high winds or on pollution alert days. res must be attended until completely extinguished, and adequate fire suppression equipment present, on-recreational burning must be done during daylight hours and extinguished prior to sunset. ben burning is not allowed at mobile home parks, apartment or condominium complexes or buildings of more an four dwelling units.

res must be extinguished if they create a fire hazard, nuisance, pollution problem or threat to public health, urning must comply with all other federal, state and local laws, rules or ordinances.

iditional restrictions apply in Lake, Porter, Clark or Floyd counties. No open burning of trash, leaves yard waste is allowed.
