Suicide Deaths	Suicide deaths are on the rise in Elkhart county and currently, the county has a higher suicide death rate than the state of Indiana
Access to Care	17% of adults and 12% of children are uninsured in Elkhart County.
Cancer	Elkhart County has a lower rate of cancer than the Healthy People 2020 goal
Environmental Health	Grant funding for lead poisoning is currently being secured for the county for rising numbers in children needing treatment

412 people in Elkhart County died from heart disease complications in 2020.

This condition can be managed with a proper diet and physical activity.

Access to Care and Vulnerable Populations

17% of adults and 12% of children are uninsured in Elkhart County ^[10]. This can prove to be life threatening to those in vulnerable populations.

In Elkhart in 2019 [11]:

- 5,843 people were living with hearing difficulties
- 3,489 people were living with vision difficulties
- 9,154 people were living with cognitive difficulties
- 11,077 people were living with ambulatory difficulties
- 3,788 people were living with self-care difficulties
- 8,635 people were struggling with living independently


A portion of people in each of these groups are not able to see a doctor for help due to a lack of insurance coverage.



Elkhart County is seeing a decrease in cancer related deaths, but a major increase in heart disease related deaths ^[5, 7].






Childhood Lead Poisoning

Prevent Childhood Lead Poisoning


Exposure to lead can seriously harm a child's health.



- Elkhart County currently has 60 children waiting on treatment for lead poisoning [15].
- The state of Indiana is expecting at least 216 children to need treatment in the next two years ^[15].
- The county has applied for a grant to case manage, mitigate, and do lead risk assessments for the children in need.

Foodborne Illnesses

Prevalence rates of diseases caused by foodborne illness have remained steady or decreased in Elkhart County thanks to a rigorous restaurant inspection program. In 2021, zero cases of foodborne illness were reported for investigation. ^[15]



Illicit Discharge

- Environmental Health coordinates with other county departments
- These illicit discharges include the direct connection of sewage systems to field tiles that outfall to our many ditches, creeks and streams, typically in areas with heavy clay soils.



Illicit Discharge con't

- The Health Department promotes the elimination of sewage from Elkhart County's water ways whether it be through the installation of approved private on-site sewage systems or through larger approved community systems.
- They also work with both the cities of Elkhart and Goshen when performing tests for the surface water sampling and monitoring program. The parameters tested for include e-coli and total dissolved solids. The water temperature, phosphates, nitrates, pH and dissolved oxygen are also checked.



- Elkhart County has maintained a constant infant death rate from 2018 to 2021. [6]
- 14 infants under the age of 1 year old died in 2021. [15]
- A percentage of infants with low birth weights was maintained at 7% from 2107 to 2021.
- The rate of teen pregnancy (ages 15-19) decreased by 44% from 2011 to 2021. [6]
- Elkhart County's black infant mortality rate is 23.4 while white counterparts is 7.7. [17]
- 46516 is the worst zip code in the county. [17]


Infant deaths per year in Elkhart County






The average number of reported bad mental health days in 2021 was 15% higher than in 2017 [5].


The data below represents suicide rates in children and teens from ages 0-19 in Elkhart County [15].



While suicide rates are increasing everywhere, they have more than doubled in Elkhart County and the rate in 2020 was almost twice as large as the rate of Indiana for children.²¹




Since the beginning of the Coronavirus Pandemic, Elkhart County has seen [8]:


- A mortality rate of 313 people per 100,000
- A positive case rate of 26,028 per 100,000
- 2 major spikes in cases
 - The highest number of newly reported positive cases in one day so far was in January 2022 with 571 cases.


The Indiana Department of Health is estimating 891 Elkhart County residents have died with COVID-19 being a contributing factor.
